1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Vishwakarma College of Arts, Commerce and Science (VCACS) is one of leading educational establishments in Pune. It was established in 2007 by the Bansilal Ramnath Agarwal Charitable Trust (B.R.A.C.T), Pune. The trust was established on 16th June 1975 and registered as a public trust under Bombay Public Trust Act, 1950 vide No. E-531 (Pune) and started social and educational activities in Maharashtra. Vishwakarma Group, which has been in the field of education for more than 27 years. It has over 425 scholarly faculties in the Engineering, IT, Management fields who have contributed immensely in educating thousands of students in the last 27 years.

In the Academic Year, 2007-08 BRACT has started "Vishwakarma College of Arts, Commerce and Science" (VCACS), Pune. Our college offers B.Com. and B.Sc. courses of Pune University for the Academic Year 2007-08 with 120 intake capacity each. From the Academic Year 2008-09 we received permission from Pune University for the BBA, BCA later Nomenclature BBA(CA), BBM (IB) later Nomenclature BBA(IB) and B. Sc. (Computer Science) courses with intake capacity of 80 students each. In addition, VCACS has received permission to start foreign language certification and diploma courses viz. German, Japanese, French and English with an intake capacity of 60 students each. From the Academic Year 2011-12, we received permission from Pune University and Government of Maharashtra for M.Sc. (Computer Science) with intake 30. Additional division permission received for B.Sc. (Computer Science) with intake 80 and M.Sc. (Computer Science) with intake 30 from the academic year 2012-13.

From the Academic Year 2019-20, we received permission from Savitribai Phule Pune University and Government of Maharashtra for M. Sc (Computer Application) with intake 30 and M.Com with intake 60. Additional division permission received for B.Com. with 120.

Institutional Weakness

1. The college has a shortage of M.Phil., Ph.D., NET, and SET faculty members.

2. Because the college doesn't currently provide any industrial consulting, students may have fewer opportunity to obtain real-world experience and apply their expertise to some extent.

3. Because the institution lacks the authority to modify the curriculum in response to market demands, there may be a disconnect between the skills taught and the abilities that companies are looking for.

4. Currently college doesnt provide Research Center due to inadequate research experts.

5. The lack of interdisciplinary programmes at the institution can limit the opportunity for students to acquire a wide variety of skills and knowledge.

Institutional Opportunity

VCACS, established in the year 2007, is one of the renowned colleges in the region. Although not located at the heart of the city, the college has full strength for all the courses. The following opportunities lie ahead of the college:

1. Establishing an innovation center: Many colleges are developing innovation centers to promote entrepreneurial ideas and products that contribute to societal change. Our college can establish an innovation center to promote innovation and creativity among students and faculty members.

2. Offering cutting-edge skills: The School of Computer Engineering can impart cutting-edge skills through teaching, R&D, and industrial consultancy in frontier areas of Computer Science. This can help students to stay updated with the latest technologies and trends in the industry.

3. Providing research opportunities: Our college can provide research opportunities to students through one-onone or small group projects. This can help students to develop research methodology-related skills and aptitude.

Curricular Aspects

At the beginning of each academic session, college prepares its proposed academic calendar, which is uploaded on the college website. The proposed academic calendar is prepared according to the notices and circulars received from the Savitribai Phule Pune University (SPPU). Students are informed about the academic calendar of the college notifying the probable teaching days, dates of internal examinations, curriculum, extension related and co-curricular activities.

The appointment of internal squads and supervisors to ensure fair conduct during examinations is crucial. These individuals play a significant role in maintaining the integrity of the examination process and ensuring that it is conducted in a transparent and unbiased manner.

The inclusion of Value Added or Certificate or add-on courses to prepare students for their future is an excellent initiative. These courses provide additional skills and knowledge beyond the core curriculum, equipping students with a competitive edge and enhancing their prospects in the job market or further studies.

Organizing guest lectures on important topics such as Gender Equality, Human Values, Environment, and Sustainability is highly beneficial. These lectures contribute to the holistic development of students by promoting awareness, understanding, and critical thinking on these crucial subjects. Regular intervals between guest lectures ensure a consistent engagement with these topics throughout the academic year.

Overall, these practices and initiatives demonstrate a comprehensive approach to education that focuses not only on academic excellence but also on personal development, ethical values, and social responsibility.

The institution has implemented a structured feedback mechanism to gather feedback about the curriculum from various stakeholders such as students, alumni, employers, parents, and teachers. This feedback is collected at the end of every academic year, indicating a regular and systematic approach to assessment and improvement.

The institution also acknowledges the importance of necessary arrangements and procurements to support an effective teaching and learning environment. This proactive approach ensures that the necessary tools, materials, and resources are provided to facilitate an optimal learning experience.

By regularly obtaining feedback from students, alumni, employers, parents, and teachers, the institution demonstrates its commitment to maintaining and upgrading quality standards in teaching. This feedback-driven approach allows the institution to make informed decisions and implement changes that align with the needs and expectations of various stakeholders. Ultimately, this practice contributes to the continuous improvement and overall quality enhancement of the institution's teaching methods and curriculum.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

The admissions process at VCACS is widely publicized through the prospectuses, online inquiries from our website, advertisements in regional/ national newspapers, and word of mouth.

The admissions committee is comprised of members from various departments and is formed annually. The Principal and HOD appoint an 'Admissions Officer'- who oversees the general operation of the admissions committee. The college follows to both the applicable norms for affiliated institutions and the Maharashtra government's reservation norms. Students from economically weak segments of society are admitted by allowing them to pay their tuition fee in installments. In exceptional cases, a certain amount of fees is waived upon after the approval from the authority. The institution provides scholarships to qualified applicants in accordance with the regulations. During the admissions process, course coordinators and concerned faculty counsel students and parents individually.

To bridge the knowledge deficit of enrolled students, the college conducts various curriculum-related activities such as Seminars, Debate Competitions, Quizzes, Special Guidance on various advanced topics, and Lecture Series under the 'Students Welfare Unit' as well as additional activities such as the 'Soft Skill Development Program' and the 'Tally ERP' course. Students from other states, countries, and various regions of the state of Maharashtra are admitted to the program of their choice and given equal opportunities in all college activities.

The result analysis assists the department Head in determining the passing percentage and enhancing future results by following the direct and indirect assess method. Then, under the supports of the 'Student Welfare Organization', the college has established a 'Special Guidance Scheme' for 'slow-learners' as well as for 'fast learners'. The College has established an 'Examination Committee' to oversee the evaluation process year-round. Besides this, under collaborative learning- the college organizes a variety of activities under various committees, such as Women's Forum, Elocution and Debate, NSS activities, Students Welfare activities, Vocational Guidance, 'Vishwacarnival – college social gathering', and contributions to the college magazine 'Vishwakarmiya', etc.

The college has subscribed to e-resources through the UGC INFLIBNET N-LIST program. Thus, the college makes ongoing efforts to evaluate continuously and improve the Teaching-Learning and Evaluation processes.

Research, Innovations and Extension

The college has a well-defined Research Policy and Code of Ethics formulated by the Research Cell which acts as the guiding tool for researchers. Non-government funded research projects are carried out by the faculty and students in last 5 years.

Under Ecosystem the College has set up three cells i.e. EDC, IPR, and RM to help Science and Commerce majors develop their creative problem-solving and business acumen to their fullest potential. VCACS features "VISHWABHINAV" a Platform designed to encourage the development and dissemination of knowledge or technology amongst the students. It encompasses a variety of activities that take place throughout the year involving notably- **"VishwaNirvaha", "VishwaAnubhav", "VishwaKarmiya" "VishwaRisingStar", "VishwaCarnival", "VishwaVardhini" and "VishwaTech".** The institution conducted 96 conferences, workshop, seminar including on Research Methodology, Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) and entrepreneurship during the last five years. Faculty members have published 36 research papers which are listed in UGC care list and Scopus. 35 research papers and books published in journals of national and international repute with high impact factor and with ISBN number.

Vishwakarma College of Arts, Commerce & Science Kondhwa, Pune, is a leader in social work, focusing on extension activities to sensitize students to social issues and their holistic development. During the academic years 2017-2022, the college organized various activities, including the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, which cleaned village roads and Panwate Chowk temple area, and provided information on literacy, employment, agriculture, and farmer accountancy. The college also implemented road safety campaigns, surveys of children, plastic waste management, smoking cessation, and tree plantation. The students of VCACS have consistently made important contributions to the community. The college has received numerous recognitions time and again by various organizations. Naigaon, Mulshi Taluka, Pune District, was totally sanitized by college students as part of the 'Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan'. The villagers were educated on the value of personal hygiene. As a result, the college was recognized by the Naigaon Gramme Panchayat of the Pune district. The institution has conducted 63 outreach programs through NSS during the last five years.

The institution have 84 functional MoU, Linkages and Collaboration with various institutions, industries in India as well as outside India for internship, on-the-job training, project work, student / faculty exchange and collaborative research during the last five years.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

At VCACS, we strive to create a favorable environment for teaching-learning, cultural activities, sports, and physical fitness. We continuously enhance our facilities to meet the needs of our students and provide a holistic educational experience.

We have 19 spacious, well-ventilated classrooms equipped with LCD projectors. Additionally, we offer ICTbased classrooms with internet access and multimedia tools.

The principal's office, staff rooms, SDO office, NSS room, sports room, conference room, and administrative offices are important infrastructure of VCACS. Clean washrooms for boys and girls are available.

We have 9 well-equipped computer laboratories with modern PCs, licensed software, and internet connectivity.

We also have 2 electronics labs for ideal learning of electronics studies.

To ensure uninterrupted internet access, 40 Mbps main leased line and 5 Mbps supportive internet access through Wi-Fi network is provided. The network is secured with antivirus and firewall protection.

We are using spacious auditorium(sister institute) to hosts various programs, cultural events, and seminars. We also have four seminar halls equipped with ICT facilities.

Our library, Dnyansagar, is the heart of our college. It houses a diverse collection of approximately 11,550 books, including textbooks, reference materials, journals, and periodicals. The library facilitates to access newspapers, magazines, and educational CDs. SLIM21. The library also holds an Institutional Membership of MCCIA, Dnyansagar has also subscribed to the N-List of UGC INFLIBNET Shodhganga, providing users access to more than 6,000 e-journals, over 1,99,500 e-books, and 6,00,000 e-books through NDL (National Digital Library). it also spent an average of Rs. 1,58,824/- per year (2021-2022) for the purchase of books and journals

For Physical Challenged students facilites like Ramps, handrails, wheelchairs, and accessible restrooms are available.

Support facilities includes hostels, a canteen, a bank with an ATM, PMT bus stop, stationery shops, intercom, water purifiers, CCTV surveillance, GENSET, power backup, medical facilities, biometric attendance, ERP systems, lifts, fire extinguishers and hydrant system.

College has dedicated cultural committee This committee organizes various activities and competitions promoting cultural and traditional values. Qualified physical director handles sports-related activities. A mini gym and a Yoga room are available for physical fitness and wellness.

Student Support and Progression

The college offers excellent infrastructure and other support services for the welfare of the students. The institution publishes prospectus containing details of courses, no of seats for each course, facilities etc. every year. The students belonging to reserved category (i.e., SC, ST, OBC etc.) receive scholarships from Social Welfare department, Government of Maharashtra. Students from economically weaker section of society are given concession in the fees to be paid to college.

Placement cell organizes various workshops and guest lectures to facilitate student progression to higher level of education and employment. Placement cell of the college invites companies for campus interviews and selection of Jobs. The notice regarding job opportunities and relevant information is displayed on the notice board as well as conveyed on class WhatsApp group.

As per the University guidelines, several activities are conducted under the various University Departments such as NSS, Student development etc. Students belonging to cultural committee are encouraged to take part in cultural competitions organized by university and affiliated colleges. Students are also encouraged to take part in various local, state, national and international level competitions. As a result, college won many prizes in various intellectual, cultural and sports competitions.

The college ensures safe environment in the campus by establishing Anti-ragging Committee, Student Grievance committee, Internal compliance committee the reports of these committees are NIL. A suggestion box is placed in the college for student's complaints. College also runs Student's Council as per the rules of University. Various events and days are organized by this committee.

The college has a registered Alumni Association. Meetings are organized by alumni association for their alumni once in a year. Such meetings help to develop a long-lasting relationship with their alumni. Alumni Association conducts various activities throughout the year.

Governance, Leadership and Management

IQAC, which is participatory, decentralized, transparent, and transformational, directs the college's governance.

There are several committees in the college, including the ICC, the Grievance Redressal Committee, the Anti-Ragging Committee, and the VishwaCarnival, among others. The IQAC is in responsible for designing, developing, and implementing perspective/strategic plans to ensure the overall development of the students in accordance with the vision and mission statements for educational excellence. The immediate needs of the college for appropriate and reliable provision are satisfied.

E-governance is widely utilised in the areas of administration, finances and accounting, student admission and support, and testing. For the college's governance and administration, each unit has a defined place in the organisational structure.

The Principal is given considerable autonomy in dealing with academic issues. The Principal is assisted by Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) thus effecting delegation of powers. The college staff is benefitted from numerous welfare measures.

40 professional development programs were conducted, 14.74% of teachers were provided with financial support and 100% of them are participated in FDPs organized by the college and attended during the last 5 years.

Performance appraisal is also practiced. The institution manages to optimize the expenditure within the available funds using strategies to maximize resources utilization and funds mobilization wherever possible. A substantial amount is spent on infrastructure maintenance/up gradation, purchases, and salary every month. Budgeting / utilization / future planning are also monitored and financial audits (internal and external) are conducted regularly.

In the Post accreditation period, IQAC has contributed significantly to institutionalizing the quality assurance strategies and processes by organizing quality initiatives. including ARIIA participation, AISHE participation, and ISO certification.

IQAC periodically reviews the teaching-learning process, evaluation of the attainment of POs and COs, structured feedback, performance appraisal of teaching and non-teaching staff. The IQAC conducts various

audits such as Academic and Administrative audit, Green audit, E-Waste audit, Structural audit, etc.

Institutional preparedness for NEP

1. Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary:	Students's intellectual, aesthetic, social, physical, emotional, and moral capacities are all interconnected, making this one of NEP 2020 primary focuses in higher education. The core concepts of NEP, including diversity for all in curriculum and pedagogy, the use of technology breakthroughs in education, the promotion of sound judgment, and the development of original ideas were the subject of a roundtable discussion among the teaching staff. In collaboration with SPPU Pune, the
	college held a two-day national workshop on NEP on February 9th and 10th, 2023. There were over 80
	people in attendance, and they came from all over India to have their say on the matter. Institute plans to

	provide short-term and vocational courses to offer interdisciplinary subjects, giving students the chance to enroll and complete programs leading to a degree with interdisciplinary expertise. The goal is to help students develop marketable skills that will allow them to become self-sufficient rather than dependent on traditional employment. The Institute is currently taking the necessary steps to ensure that all of its programs have clearly articulated learning strategies and outcomes, as well as courses and unit learning outcomes that detail the specific knowledge, skills, attitudes, and values that each learner is expected to acquire. Each step of the Institute's educational process is carefully planned to include components that aid in meeting the goals of NEP 2020 for higher education. Multidisciplinary courses including digital marketing (combining management and computer science), the Internet of Things (combining electronics and computer science), tally-ERP, etc. are offered by the college. The college is associated with the Choice based credit system at Savitribai Phule Pune University. Additional credit can be earned by participating in a social poll, taking a short course, taking an online course in various fields, or visiting businesses that use real-world applications.
2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):	Savitribai Phule Pune University, which established the credit system for its normal courses, is affiliated with VCACS. Academic bank of credits (ABC) is a new programme at SPPU. The students are provided with a link to sign up for it. The examination office notified all students that they needed to create an ABC- ID in order to have a central location for their academic records. We have created a video on "How to make ABC-ID" ; and posted it to our YouTube account to spread ABC-ID knowledge. Students are also encouraged to accomplish this using any and all social media platforms available to them.
3. Skill development:	The college routinely schedules events designed to improve students's skill sets. We have MOU with CCA Education Pvt Ltd, Pune. The CCA offers courses in share marketing, Tally, and computerized accounting taught by industry experts. CCTV installation workshops were held for students specializing in computer science and business under the auspices of our authorized National skill development center. On the occasion of 2019 World Entrepreneur's Day (August 21), the Commerce

	Department established the EDC (Entrepreneurship Development Cell). The mission of the Entrepreneurship Development Cell at VCACS is to encourage an entrepreneurial spirit in the student body. It's a place where students, young entrepreneurs, established business leaders, and professors can join to network and exchange ideas. Mentoring opportunities are made available by the EDC through its extensive network of professionals, business owners, investors, experts in related fields, etc. A variety of perspectives on student entrepreneurship and skill development are presented during the annual "VishwaNirwah" festival. The college makes concerted attempts to instill in its students the satya, dharma, shanti, prem, ahimsa, scientific temper, and citizenship ideals enshrined in the Constitution and shared by everyone everywhere. Workshops like "Workshop on Financial Empowerment of Girl's" and Workshop on "Women Empowerment" for Girls are specifically designed to help female students acquire the knowledge and abilities they need to succeed in the workforce and in life.
4. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course):	The atmosphere at Vishwakarma College of Arts, Commerce, and Science is one that encourages original thought. - The College gives weightage to academic improvement and equal importance is given to overall development of students by encouraging them to work with various forums of the college.

- Principal address and orientation programme is organized every year for newly admitted students to make them understand the mechanism for curriculum delivery and implementation.
- The institute has realized that the ICT helps in smooth functioning of teaching, learning and administration so it is being applied in steps whenever and where ever possible and feasible.
- The college organizes workshops, seminars from various fields to share their knowledge with students. Institutealso believes the overall development of students by forming Student Council, Cultural Committee, Sports Committee, NSS Committee etc.

The dates and schedule of internal assessment activities are communicated to the students via notices or official Whatsapp groups well in advance.

? Additionally, the university conducts internal examinations for all courses once per semester.

? The coordinator prepares the schedule for the examination, which is then approved by the Head of Department.

? Within 10 days of the assessment, the class teacher prepares cumulative results, and once the Internal Marks portal is opened by the University, the course coordinator fills in the marks.

? The entire process is closely monitored by the CEO and HOD to ensure accuracy and fairness. For the assessment of the project, the faculty coordinator works in consultation with the HoD to prepare a schedule for the students' presentations, which is communicated to them in advance. Students present their work or report in PPT mode, and it is evaluated based on various parameters set by the respective coordinator. It is

The implementation of the syllabi with changes and the process of evaluation of the learners are monitored by the higher authorities, the management of the college, and the Principal. Our institution promotes the teachers to organize workshops as well as deputies to participate in seminars and conferences. Moreover, they are promoted to present and publish research papers to achieve the Course Outcomes and Programme Outcomes successfully. Measurement of attainment of POs and COs is done through formative and summative methods. A continuous and comprehensive evaluation is done regularly to know the attainment. Class tests are scheduled by the faculty members and evaluation is done after which the strategy for improvement is

made. Group discussions and seminars are organized and each student is made to participate compulsorily in these. Through the seminars and group discussions, the thinking process of the students is also assessed and the skills and knowledge are tested. Home assignments are given to the students; it helps to measure the attainment program specific outcomes. Some activities like quiz competitions are also held which makes the institution know about the knowledge of the students. With the help of various Cocurricular activities, the behavioral outcomes of the students are assessed. External examinations are conducted as per the SPPU norms. Consistent with the trend among many institutions to establish innovation centers that support entrepreneurial ideas and products that contribute to societal change, these cells also cultivate strong intra-and inter-institutional cooperation with many stakeholders.

Vishwakarma College of Arts, Commerce, and Science has fostered an atmosphere that encourages students and faculty to develop their social skills and research abilities. Every year, the College holds the "VishwaTech" Event to grab students' interest in research, and it publishes its own magazine named "Vishwakarmiya" to encourage students to pursue careers in academia. 3.4 Extension Activities

3.4.1 Outcomes of Extension activities in the neighborhood community in terms of impact and sensitizing the students to social issues for their holistic development during the last five years.

Response:

Vishwakarma College of Arts, Commerce & Science Kondhwa, Pune, is a leader in social work, focusing on extension activities to sensitize students to social issues and their holistic development. During the academic years 2017-2022, the college organized various activities, including the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, which cleaned village roads and Panwate Chowk temple area, and provided information on literacy, employment, agriculture, and farmer accountancy. The college also implemented road safety campaigns, surveys of children, plastic waste management, smoking cessation, and tree plantation.

Another notable initiative was the collection of clothes for needy people in Shivane, Warje, and Pirangut through More Trust. The college collaborated with the Good Will India initiative of More Welfare Trust to distribute ready-made clothes to needy people in different parts of Pune on a larger scale .

A blood donation camp was organized in December 2017 in association with the College and Regional Blood Bank BJ Government Medical College and Sassoon General Hospital Pune, with 164 students registered and 164 blood groups tested. Road safety and helmet compulsory drives were also implemented, with Ashok Morale and Pune City Police Traffic Department providing valuable support. The college participated in relief work in flood-affected areas of Kolhapur and Sangli, collecting food and medicines and delivering them.

Lastly, the college organized a tree distribution and planting program, setting a world record by distributing 16661 saplings in the Guinness World Record under Swach Vari, Swast Vari, Nirmal Vari, and Harit Vari.

College also participated in a river cleaning campaign organized by Savitribai Phule Pune University National Service Scheme Department. The college took responsibility for cleaning the Mula Mula river at Warje Bridge, involving 43 students and two professors. The college also organized a workshop on "Human Rights, Indian Judiciary and Indian Constitution" and conducted natural disaster relief efforts in flood-affected areas.

The college also organized a Covid Immunization Camp on November 25th, 2021, involving students, parents, and citizens. The camp provided education and support to differently abled students, including orphans, through games and activities. The college's efforts aimed to promote social consciousness and cooperative attitude among its students.

3.4.2 Awards and recognitions received for extension activities from government / government recognised bodies

The students of VCACS have consistently made important contributions to the community. The college has received numerous recognitions time and again by various organizations.

Naigaon, Mulshi Taluka, Pune District, was totally sanitized by college students as part of the 'Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan'. The villagers were educated on the value of personal hygiene. As a result, the college was recognized by the Naigaon Gramme Panchayat of the Pune district.

Pune City implements many measures to improve traffic flow. Under the activities of **'Traffic rule awareness and helmet compulsion'**, students from our college had done awareness driverigorously with the assistance of the Pune city traffic department. The college has received approval from the Pune City Transport Department to do so.

As part of the College's ongoing commitment to the community, a blood donation camp is held annually. Thanks to the generosity of EM Hospital, BJ Medical College (Sassoon Hospital), and the Pune Blood Bank, blood donation stations were set up on campus. A certificate and honorary badge were presented to the college by the aforementioned blood banks.

In collaboration with the **'Shaheed Bhagat Singh Foundation**' and VCACS, an elderly health camp was held. Because of the student's dedication to the 'Umesh More Foundation's road safety awareness campaign', the college has been officially recognized for its continuous efforts.

Due to unfortunate health crisis and its worldwide effect, our college made every effort to participate during this trying time of Covid Pandemic. The college students were recognized as a "Covid Warrior" by the 'WinzarGramme Panchayat' in Taluka Velha, District Pune, and the 'Gurukul Education Institute' in Maharshi Nagar, both for its efforts to educate the public about the virus and disseminate preventative measures like masks, hand sanitizer, food ration kits, and counseling services.

The college examinedits staff and students during 'Covid' period. The College hosted a vaccination camp for covid. The Pune Municipal Health Department sent a letter of thanks to the college for hosting a successful covid vaccination session. Students from the college occasionally visit 'Aniket Sevabhavi Sanstha' to work with the special needs and orphaned pupils. Many students worked as a counselor for special needs children. As a result, 'Aniket Sevabhavi Sanstha' has written a letter of appreciation to the College.

The villagers of 'Winjar' received a grant from the 'Gramme-Panchayat' to fund a college that would educate them on topics such as drug addiction treatment, women's health, student counselling, available jobs, the district industry centre, and government assistance programs.

In support of 'Swachh Bharat Abhiyan', students from VCACS assembled near the office of the Pune Municipal Corporation and cleaned the Mula-Mutha river-bed. The trash along the riverbank was also separated into two categories: plastic trash and electronic garbage. There were 180 people in total that helped with this effort. At the same time, under the 'Swachh Bharat Abhiyan program', students from our college cleaned up public spaces in the Yevlewadi, Kondhwa, and Katraj neighborhoods.

Posters and street plays were used to educate the public on where and how to segregate trash, along with proper disposal. Almost 170 students participated and carried out the activity. Studentscarried out

food distribution and cleaning of the temple grounds in cooperation with the 'Shree Mahalakshmi Mata Mandir Trust' at Kothrud. A letter of appreciation from the trust was received by our college.

At VCACS, we strive to create a conducive environment for learning, cultural activities, sports, and physical fitness. We continuously enhance our facilities to meet the needs of our students and provide a holistic educational experience.

Classrooms: We have 19 spacious and well-ventilated classrooms which are designed to facilitate effective teaching- learning and well equipped with LCD and projectors, We also have ICT-based classrooms with internet access and multimedia learning tools.

Library: Our library is the heart of our college. We maintain a well-stocked collection of various books, including reference materials, textbooks, journals, and periodicals related to various faculties. Our automated library system is SLIM 21 which ensures easy access to resources.

Computer Laboratories: We have 09 well-equipped computer laboratories with modern PCs, licensed software, and internet connections. Labs are utilized for practical sessions, exams and student oriented activities.

Electronics Lab: We boast two well-equipped electronics labs that provide a conducive environment for learning and excelling in the electronics syllabus.

Internet Facility: Uninterrupted 40 Mbps main leased line and 5 Mbps supportive internet access is available to students and faculty through our Wi-Fi network. We have implemented security measures like Antivirus and firewall to protect against threats and viruses.

Auditorium: Our college is using a spacious auditorium of sister institute located in our campus for various events such as induction programs, cultural events, and seminars.

Seminar Halls: We have four seminar halls equipped with ICT-based facilities for workshops, seminars, and group discussions.

Devyang Facilities: College has facilities for physically challenged students with disabilities, including ramps, handrails, wheelchairs, restrooms, and scribes.

Washrooms and Common Rooms: Separate clean washrooms for boys and girls are available, also ladies room with necessary facilities.

Principal's office, Staff rooms, SDO office, NSS room Sports room, Conference room, Adminstrative offices are the important part of infrastrure

Additional Support Facilities: Hostels, a canteen, a bank with an ATM, transportation service through PMT buses, stationery shops, water purifiers and coolers at each floor, CCTV for safety and surveillance systems, power backup, GENSET for uninteruppted power, medical facilities like on call doctor, store rooms for storage, biometric attendance systems, ERP system, Lift, Fire extingquisher-Hydrant System

Cultural Activities: College has dedicated cultural committee with cultural secreatery. This committee organizes various activities and competitions promoting cultural and traditional values. Students actively participate and winners are awarded prizes during the Annual Day celebration.**Track and Field Facilities**: Students can practice athletic events on our 50-meter track, with long jump and throwing facilities. Parallel bars, horizontal bars, and a rope climbing area are also available.

Dance and Music: Students participate in dance and singing competitions, both inter-collegiate and intracollegiate, with the required facilities provided.

Sports: We have a qualified physical director who organizes sports-related activities. Outdoor and indoor games are available, promoting sportsmanship, discipline, cooperation, and fitness. The college has achieved success in various competitions, and Sports Day is celebrated annually.

4.2 Library as a Learning Resource

4.2.1 Library is automated with digital facilities using Integrated Library Management System (ILMS), adequate subscriptions to e-resources and journals are made. The library is optimally used by the faculty and students

Response:

Our library Dnyansagar is a pillar of VCACS, It is a vibrant hub of knowledge and learning, catering to the academic needs of students and faculty.

The library houses a diverse collection of approximately 11,550 books,apart from textbooks and reference books it includes encyclopedias, yearbooks, foreign language materials, competitive exam books, dictionaries, and study materials covering various domains and fields of knowledge. We also offer a substantial number of novels, literature books, books on social issues, and leisure reading materials in English, Hindi, and Marathi.

In addition to the book collection, Dnyansagar provides access to newspapers, national and international journals, magazines, and periodicals in both English and regional languages. Users can also benefit from a collection of around 250 educational CDs and videos. The library organizes activities such as Library Orientation and Reading Inspiration Day to promote a culture of reading. Moreover, Dnyansagar Library holds an Institutional Membership of the Mahratha Chamber Of Commerce, Industries, (MCCIA), allowing users to access the collection.

To cater to the digital needs of the users, Dnyansagar has an e-library section equipped with computers for accessing e-journals, e-books, and e-resources such as Shodhganga. E-journals can be remotely accessed through a username and password. The library offers a comprehensive collection of books, newspapers, periodicals, magazines, journals, e-resources, and computers with internet access, enabling teachers and students to access information, knowledge, and references for study, research, competitive examinations, and additional reading.

The library has implemented the Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) called SLIM 21. The SLIM 21 software was purchased on 18.06.2014, and the Web OPAC was acquired in the year 2015-16.

This automation has streamlined library operations and provides the Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) facility for students and faculty members. The OPAC system allows users to view bibliographical details about the collections and check the availability of books at any time and from anywhere. Barcoding of all books ensures efficient book issuance and return processes, as the system automatically fetches the barcode number.

Annual maintenance contracts (AMC) have been carried out in the years 2016-17, 2017-18, and 2021-22 to ensure the smooth functioning of the library's automation system.

Dnyansagar has also subscribed to the N-List of UGC INFLIBNET Shodhganga, providing users access to more than 6,000 e-journals, over 1,99,500 e-books, and 6,00,000 e-books through NDL (National Digital Library). The library also allocates an average of Rs. 1,58,824/- per year (2021-2022) for the purchase of books and journals to enhance the collection.

On a daily basis, Dnyansagar Library serves an average of 85-105 users for book issuance, returns, OPAC searches, e-journal access, and utilization of the reading hall by students and faculty members.

Wi-Fi Facility: The college has implemented Wi-Fi connectivity throughout the campus, ensuring that both students and faculty members have access to this facility. The Wi-Fi service is available 24/7, allowing users to connect seamlessly from classrooms to the library to the labs.

Internet Speed: We provide a high-speed internet facility with a speed of 40 Mbps. Our fully networked campus, equipped with state-of-the-art IT infrastructure, computing resources, and communication resources, enables students to utilize services such as email, web browsing, and web-based application downloads/uploads. These resources are invaluable for their project work and seminar preparations.

Data security and privacy: To ensure the security of our Wi-Fi network, each student and faculty member is assigned a unique username and password. Access to the Wi-Fi network is granted by the system administrator, guaranteeing that only authorized users can connect to the network.

Antivirus and Firewall: The college takes security seriously, and our Wi-Fi network is protected by a firewall. All internet traffic passing through the network is scanned for threats and viruses at the gateway level. - Use of CCTV Cameras 24 hour CCTV surveillance is maintained in the college. It helps to keep a check on antisocial activities. Students and other employees in the college too remain cautious about the surveillance. Discipline is also maintained and it also provides a sense of security to the students and even their guardians. Students wear identity cards at all times to ensure their identity
- Discipline in campus There is a Discipline Committee in the institution to take care of safety and security of the students. It also keeps an eye on the working of all the employees as well as the activities of the students within the institution. VCACS aims at zero tolerance against eve teasing/ragging with wide publicity which is maintained by the Discipline Committee.
- Parent teacher meeting- Regular parent-teacher meetings are organized to bring the students –parents and teachers together. Updates are provided about the overall development and performance of the students. Parents' issues related to their wards are also entertained.
- Counselling to girl students is provided whenever is necessary.

Objectives of the Practice –

- Awakening about Maintaining social awareness and social consciousness

The Context - The COVID-19 outbreak emerged as an unprecedented challenge for the governments, communities as well as individuals.Covid-19 pandemic is disrupting immunization activities in multiple ways – Additional burden on health systems – Reduced availability of health personnel for supply chain and services – Decreased demand for vaccination (need for physical distancing and/or community reluctance)

The Practice –

In the view of Covid-19 pandemic VCACS have organized a Vaccination Drive for college students and staff at Vishwakarma College of Arts, Commerce, and Science ,Kondhwa, Pune, in order to keep them protected from corona virus.

Covid-19 Vaccination programme was organized for the students, their parents and staff members of the VCACS on 25th November 2021 in the college campus from 10 am to 4 pm in collaboration with Pune Municipal Corporation Medical Team of Pune Regional Office and NIRAMAY foundation, Pune.

The Health Minister of Maharashtra state, Mr. Rajesh Tope had announced about special inoculation drive for the student's age group of 18 to 25 that the Covid-19 vaccination among the youth is the need of the hour as colleges and universities have started to open in the state from 20th Oct 2021. The Government of Maharashtra had started a week-long vaccination drive for college students in the state from 25th Oct to 2nd Nov 2021, under the campaign, 'Mission Yuva Swasthya'. The teachers and students will be inoculated as part of the drive. The college has taken online survey prior to the vaccination drive to collect data, so that the vaccination drive will be organized in appropriate way.

The following measures were recommended to help reduce the spread of COVID-19 and to protect people at increased risk of severe illness.

• Follow the physical distancing advice.

• Follow the guidance to self-isolate if you or a household member has symptoms of COVID-19 or have a COVID-19 diagnosis

- Follow Test and Protect advice.
- Follow hand hygiene and respiratory hygiene advice.
- Proper use of PPE where necessary.

• Regular cleaning of environmental surfaces and public spaces.

Evidence of Success - In these activity total 86 students, parents and staff members including teaching and administrative members were given Covishield as vaccine first and second doses as per their vaccination schedule. Later on they were asked to follow the suggestions as per doctor's advice.
